ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

The HBA's Charitable & Education Foundation's George J. Goudreau Sr. Scholarship

In 2014 The HBA Board of Trustees approved the creation of a scholarship fund in the name of the founder of the organization, George J. Goudreau Sr. George Sr, who started the local home builders association in 1942 and in 1944 he began the Ohio Home Builders Association (OHBA). As a student, George Sr. studied physics and engineering on a full scholarship from the predecessor to what is now Case Western Reserve University.

After graduation, George Sr. had hoped to pursue a graduate degree for architectural engineering, but money was tight so in 1926 he began building houses to work his way through school.

The depression temporarily diverted the company's focus to remodeling and home maintenance. By 1937, George Sr. was back building homes. Then World War II hit and builders couldn't get materials because of the war effort. George Sr. and others organized a collective voice into what became the National Homebuilders Association.

In 1986, George Sr. was nationally honored by being inducted into the National Association of Home Builders (NAHB) prestigious Hall of Fame. By 1957, the company had built about 5000 homes mainly in Cleveland, Parma, Parma Heights, Shaker Heights and Elyria, *and primarily mid-priced houses for working class families*. George Sr. diversified into land development, retail and office development, apartment buildings and management for a more consistent income stream.

Local HBA Past President and a Lifetime NAHB Trustee, George Goudreau Jr. is very pleased about the HBA's scholarship in the name of his father, "Knowing how my father felt about the importance and value of both higher and continuing education, and how he championed the offering of educational courses and seminars for our members by NAHB, I'm very sure he would be truly humbled and honored to know that the HBA of Greater Cleveland had created an educational scholarship in his name.

AWARDS/FUNDING

Awards will be made periodically in an amount established by the Trustees of the Fund.

Funding is obtained by contributions from the **HBA Greater Cleveland Charitable & Education Foundation** and individual donors. Donations may be in the form of cash, bonds, stock, real estate, etc.

APPLICATION

In order to apply for a George J. Goudreau Scholarship, **the application form must be submitted and received at the HBA offices on or before April 29th of the current year**. Late or incomplete applications will be eliminated. Scholarship selections are made at a selection meeting held by the trustees each year. SELECTION PROCESS

The Trustees of the George J. Goudreau Scholarship Fund comprise the scholarship selection committee. Their meetings are held at a time designated by the trustees. Each of these areas is reviewed very carefully as the committee scores each application.

ELIGIBILITY

1. Applicants may be considered only if they will be entering or continuing their education full time at a not for profit accredited post-secondary institution or a certified technical school with an established course of study in or related to the residential building and remodeling industries.
2. Applications must be fully completed with **three (3) references** and received at the HBA's Greater Cleveland Charitable & Education Foundation office no later than **April 29, 2022**.
3. Scholarships shall be awarded periodically to be available for the fall semester of the appropriate academic school year.
4. Scholarship funds are to be applied to cover actual expenses for tuition and fees only.
5. Scholarships are awarded for an institution's academic year. Scholarship awards shall be made with the expectation that the student will remain enrolled in full time study throughout the institution's academic year.
6. Applicant must have at least a grade average of "B" in their major course of study and at time of application. Confirmation of student's grade point average must be submitted with this application by means of an official school transcript or grade report.
7. This scholarship is awarded for a one year academic term. An individual application must be completed for each subsequent academic school year.
